We had a nice turnout for the fall Bar-B-Q held at the Yacht Club last month. Many of our members attended, as well as students.



MDEQ OFFICE OF GEOLOGY NEWS FROM THE 2019 ANNUAL GSA MEETING IN PHOENIX. ARIZONA

2019 Geological Society of America Annual Meeting, Association of American State Geologists Mid-Year Meeting, 74th Annual Meeting of the North American Commission on Stratigraphic Nomenclature: At the Annual GSA meeting, I gave a paper at 8:45 am, Monday, September 23 in Session No. 96 on Geoheritage: Sharing Earth's Legacy for Scientific, Societal, and Economic Advancement. At top right is a book on the subject produced by the American Geosciences Institute in cooperation with the U.S. National Park Service, Geologic Resources Division. We have a \$100,000 contract with the NPS Geologic Resources Division to map quadrangles along the Natchez Trace Parkway. Below at left are Stephanie Omeara and Nicholas Famoso of the NPS Geologic Resources Division, who are working with us on the contract. They are standing in front of the NPS Geological Resources Division



booth at GSA. Below at right is Darrel Schmitz, who is associated with the MSU Geology Department and is also contracted to do geologic mapping along the Natchez Trace. I believe our cooperative work with Schmitz on completing the Tupelo Geologic Quadrangle map, which was rendered a digital GIS map by Jonathan Leard, helped with the completion with our NPS contract.



GSA Annual Meeting, Poster Sessions: The poster sessions at GSA were a maze of tables and a large number of posters organized under various headings for geology subdivisions. Also exhibited at the poster session was the Graduate Poster Winner of the GSA Joint South-Central, North-Central, and Rocky Mountain Section Meeting in March of 2019. The winning poster presented on March 27 by Conn Wethington and Jack Pashin of Oklahoma State University was entitled: Geologic Framework of an Anthropogenic Carbon Capture and Sequestration System at the Kemper County Energy Facility, East-Central Mississippi. The poster is shown below.



The abstract reads: The Paluxy Formation and Tuscaloosa Group in the eastern Gulf of Mexico Basin constitute a widespread succession of sandstone and shale that presents a multigigatonne storage opportunity for anthropogenic CO2. Geologic characterization of these strata at the Kemper County Energy Facility in east-central Mississippi as part of the U.S. Department of Energy's CarbonSAFE program focuses on delineating the stratigraphic framework with an emphasis on reservoir and seal analysis. Core studies in conjunction with petrophysical well-log analyses from three exploration wells have yielded a high resolution stratigraphic characterization of the targeted CO2 storage reservoirs, baffles, and seals. The porosity of Cretaceous sandstone averages 30 percent, and permeability is locally as high as 16,000 mD. Sealing strata, baffles, and barriers to flow include mudstone units in the Washita-Fredericksburg interval and the Tuscaloosa Group.

The bottom line is that the Paluxy Formation and the Tuscaloosa Goup in Mississippi can hold a whole lot of carbon dioxide as part of a sequestration system.



North American Commission on Stratigraphic Nomenclature — 74th Annual Meeting: Alabama State Geologist Nick Tew nominated me to fill a position for AASG as a commissioner on the North American Commission on Stratigraphic Nomenclature. Though this is the second year I have held that position, this was my first meeting to attend. Below at top is a picture of the head table in a square-table arrangement. In front at left is *The Geology of Mississippi*, and at right is Lucy Edwards of the U.S. Geological Survey. Next to Lucy is Commission Chair Brian Pratt representing the Canadian Society of Petroleum Geologists. At bottom are five (six including myself) commissioners (35% of the 17 present) who are pictured in *The Geology of Mississippi* doing geologic work in the state. This is a measure of the high profile Mississippi has in the field of stratigraphy and stratigraphic nomenclature. From left to right at bottom, the commissioners are Lucy Edwards, Bill Berggren, Marie Aubry, Nick Tew, and Rick Fluegeman (Rick's work in Mississippi has funded his department for some 20 years).




