

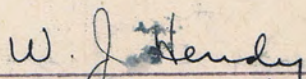

President Martin initiated discussion on the subject of sponsorship of the 1953 meeting of the GCAGS and the possibility of holding it at Biloxi. Mr. Totten moved that a discussion on this matter be postponed until the next meeting and that at that meeting our delegate be instructed as to the desire of the Society. This was seconded by Mr. True and the motion carried. A point of order was made questioning the introduction of such a business matter at a dinner meeting. Mr. Talley moved and Mr. Mellen seconded that an exception be made in this instance and that at the October 30 dinner meeting this subject be discussed and action taken. Motion carried.

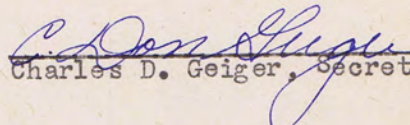

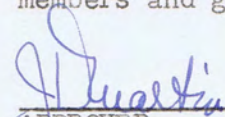
It was announced that Roger Dennison, a Distinguished Lecturer of the AAPG, would speak before the society on February 19th at a dinner meeting.

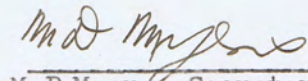

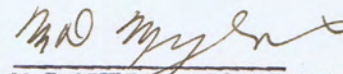
The Mississippi Geological Society held a dinners meeting in the Ball Room of the Edwards Hotel On Thursday April 16th.
